Reception Home Learning - Friday 24th April

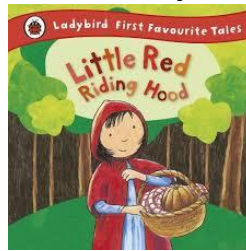

You can read a book of your choice from Bug Club. I will be giving you some links to websites where you can read ebooks throughout this week so check the activity sheets each day. Also your adult should have received login details to use the MyOn online library. (www.myon.co.uk) *If you are unsure of your login please contact your teacher.*

Literacy



Little Red Riding Hood

1. Get the pictures you drew yesterday of the story of Little Red Riding Hood and put them in order.
2. Have a go at orally retelling the story using the pictures you drew.
3. Now have a go at writing some sentences about what happened in the beginning, middle and end

Challenge:

Can you write the story of Little Red Riding Hood? (You may need to finish this over the weekend if your hand gets tired of writing!)



Bug Club – don't forget to read the books on Bug Club.

Phonics

1. Put on the Alphabet Phonics song. Click 'here'
2. Play musical statues! Pause song, freeze and say the letter name and sound that follows.
3. Can you play quick write capitals? Get your adult to say a letter name and write the capital letter.
4. Go on a capital letter hunt! Have a look in your books at home, can you spot any capital letters? Where do you find capital letters?
5. Find the Alphabet cards that came in your resources bag and place them in order.

Challenge:

Have a go at writing some sentences about what you are doing today. Remember the first word in each sentence always starts with a capital letter.

Maths

1. Watch Number blocks song '7' [click here](#)
2. Draw different representations of the number 7 For example, you could draw around seven fingers, spots on two dice to make 7, 7 petals on a flower, 7 spots on a ladybird. How many different ways can you find to represent/show the number 7? Use counting objects such as bricks or coins to help find the answers to:
3. What is one more than 7?
4. What is two more than 7?
5. What is one less than 7?
6. What is half of 7? (is it possible?)
7. What is double 7?
8. Can you share 7 things (eg. grapes, coins, toys) between 2, 3, 4, people? Can you share them so everyone gets the same?

Challenge: How many different number sentences can you think of to write that makes/ equals seven.
Eg. $3+4=7$, $1+1+1+2+2=7$, $9-2=7$
