Here's some more activities to keep you busy! **Please notice there is a time each activity should take. Please do not go over this time.** Have a break between activities if you need one.

Literacy

Favourite Movie or Story

During this long time we are staying at home it's fun to have some special times like 'Movie Night' or 'Special Storytime'. Plan when everyone in your house can be together for a Movie or Story and this week for literacy activities this is a plan of what you can do:

Day 1: Choose a Movie or Story

Day 2: Plan the snacks

Day 3: Make tickets & a poster

Day 4: Watch the movie or listen to the story

Day 5: Write a review

Today write a list of a choice of stories or movies that you could watch together with everyone in your house. Do your best at writing all the sounds you can hear and say in each word in the title of the movie or story. When you have made your list ask each person which is their favourite three choices and then see which one most people would like. Plan which day you can have the movie.

Challenge: Write a sentence to go with some of the titles saying what the movie or story is about.

Phonics

1Recap Phase 3 sound zz

1. zz is a digraph! Can you tell your adult what a digraph is (two letters, one sound) Can you show them how to write zz, and draw a sound button underneath?

2. Have a go at writing the words for the pictures below (fizz, buzz, jazz).



3. Watch this video [click here](#) and join in with the wizards to sound out the zz words.

Challenge: Get an adult to read this sentence and you write it without copying: Can a bee buzz?

Maths

1. Watch Number blocks song '8' [click here](#)
2. Draw different representations of the number 8 For example, you could draw around eight fingers, spots on two dice to make 8, 8 windows on a bus, 8 slices of pizza, 8 legs on a spider, 8 tentacles on an octopus. How many different ways can you find to represent/show the number 8? Practise writing a number 8, first have a go with your finger making the shape, then with a pencil. Use counting objects such as bricks or coins to help find the answers to:
 3. What is one more than 8?
 4. What is two more than 8?
 5. What is one less than 8?
 6. What is half of 8?
 7. What is double 8?
 8. Can you share 8 things (eg. grapes, coins, toys) between 2, 3, 4, people? Can you share them so everyone gets the same?

Challenge: How many different number sentences can you think of to write that makes/ equals eight.
Eg. $3+5=8$, $1+1+1+2+3=8$, $10-2=8$

Learn how to read and spell the word: eight (it's tricky)
